He not only lived on the land, but his children were born there. Giuseppe had a passion for wine with dreams of making a great Brunello, something that never interested the Countess. Until then Giuseppe had made small amounts for both personal and local consumption. Upon receipt he sold a portion of the estate to pay inheritance taxes, then focused on
